



2017 SEASIDE HEIGHTS BEACH INFORMATION

BEACH FEES

Regular Season Badge: \$45 per badge until May 15th and \$60 starting May 16th

Motel/Rental Units: \$45 per badge until May 15th and \$60 starting May 16th

Weekly Badge: \$35

Daily Wristband: \$8

Children 11 years of age and under: Free

Senior Citizen Season Badge: \$10 per badge (65 years of age and older with birth certificate or other proof of age and a photo ID)

* Any "lifetime" or "VIP" senior beach badge issued by the Borough of Seaside Heights prior to December 31, 2015, shall remain in full force and effect.

Military (active and retired) and spouses, civil union partners, and children: Free with valid form of military ID is required)

Each beach badge/wristband constitutes a license granted by the Borough of Seaside Heights to the licensee to use the beach. This license may be revoked if the licensee misuses the beach badge/wristband or otherwise violates any of the beach rules.

Beach badges/wristbands shall not be resold, bartered, or redeemed for cash.

No refunds or replacements for lost, misplaced, and stolen beach badges/wristbands.

We may close the beach, or particular sections of the beach, in the event of special events, concerts, inclement weather, poor ocean conditions, and similar circumstances.

BEACH OPERATING SEASON AND HOURS

The general operating season commences on the Friday of Memorial Day weekend and continues through Labor Day. Opening and closing times at the ocean beaches during the operating season are as follows (except during inclement weather):

Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Holidays: Open 9:00 a.m./Close 6:00 p.m. Cashier booths close at 6:00 p.m. Any person entering or remaining on the beach after 6:00 p.m. must possess a valid beach badge or the daily wristband of the day (purchased before 6:00 p.m.) until the beach is

cleared at 9:00 p.m. Lifeguards leave the beach at 7:00 p.m. SWIMMING IS ONLY PERMITTED WHEN LIFEGUARDS ARE ON DUTY.

Monday to Thursday: Open 9:00 a.m./Close 4:00 p.m. Cashier booths close and beach attendants leave at 4:00 p.m. Lifeguards leave the beach at 5:00 p.m. A beach badge/wristband is required to enter or remain on the beach from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. SWIMMING IS ONLY PERMITTED WHEN LIFEGUARDS ARE ON DUTY.

The Boardwalk Promenade may be closed for public use by the Seaside Heights Police Department between 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

SMOKING REGULATIONS

§ 33-8(O). The smoking and/or burning of a lighted cigar, cigarette or pipe, including any handheld electronic device which vaporizes a liquid (e.g., e-cigarettes and e-cigs), or any other matter or substance which contains tobacco, is prohibited on the Boardwalk Promenade and beaches, except in "Smoking Permitted Areas" that are conspicuously delineated by signs. Medical marijuana is not permitted on the Boardwalk Promenade and beach.

DOGS

§ 33-8 (F). Dog are not permitted to be on or upon the Boardwalk Promenade and beaches except from October 1st of each year through the Sunday before Palm Sunday of each succeeding year. Any dog owner or other person in charge or control of a dog on the Boardwalk Promenade or beaches must be in possession of a sanitary bag or utensil in order to immediately remove dog feces and to dispose of same in a sanitary manner.

SERVICE ANIMALS

Bona fide service animals accompanying persons with disabilities are permitted on the Boardwalk Promenade and beaches. A service animal is a dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability. Service animals are working animals, not pets. Examples of potentially bona fide service animals include guide dogs, hearing dogs, mobility dogs, medical alert dogs, and psychiatric service dogs. A service dog vest and identification tag are not prima facie proof that your dog is a bona fide service animal. Although we are not permitted to ask about your disability, staff are trained to make limited inquiries permitted by the ADA in order to determine whether your dog is a bona fide service animal. A "comfort dog," "emotional support dog," or "therapy dog" that is not individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability is not a bona fide service animal. All service animals must be harnessed, leashed, or tethered unless these devices interfere with the service animal's work or the individual's disability prevents using these devices. Service animal fraud is punishable by law!

COOLERS

No person shall bring onto the beach a cooler, barrel, or tub that exceeds 24 inches in length and/or has a capacity greater than thirty-six (36) quarts.

SHADE DEVICES

Umbrellas with a collapsible circular shade no greater than eight feet in diameter stretched over hinged ribs radiating from a center pole no greater than 7 feet 6 inches in height, and without grounding lines, ropes, or sides are permitted on the beach.

Devices designed or used to shade infants and small children, also known as “baby tents,” no larger than 36 inches high by 36 inches wide by 36 inches deep, are permitted on the beach.

Guests who wish to use a small sport-brella style beach shade device, one that does not exceed nine (9) feet, may be directed to set up on the west side of the beach near the Boardwalk Promenade so that the device does not block the view of other guests.

Canopy style sun shades 12' x 12' and less without side walls or screens are permitted on the beach westward of a line parallel to the back edge of the lifeguard stands. Canopy style sun shades shall be placed no less than fifteen (15) feet apart from another canopy.

Shade devices shall be secured such that uncontrolled movement of the device is restricted. Shade devices when secured with fasteners, stakes, weights, or the like shall not endanger beach patrons. Anchoring lines, tethers, or the like shall not extend beyond the perimeter of the device.

No person shall locate any shade device in an area obscuring a lifeguard's view of the ocean or in an area impeding a lifeguard's egress from a lifeguard stand, as determined by a lifeguard.

Tents, tarps, canopies larger than 12' x 12', canopies with side walls or screens, cabanas, pavilions, sport-brellas larger than nine (9) feet, temporary pop-up restroom facilities, and similar devices, or any materials mounted on supports are prohibited except in connection with an approved special event or ceremony.

Ganged shade devices of any type (i.e., shade devices that are physically attached to each other) and the use of tie outs for shade devices are prohibited.

FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR GUESTS

Bayfront and oceanfront bathing is permitted only when lifeguards are on duty regardless of operating hours. No person shall enter the bay or ocean when lifeguards are not on duty.

Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the beach at all times.

Glass bottles and glass products of any kind are prohibited on the beach at all times.

Bags and containers of any type including, without limitation, purses, knapsacks, backpacks, and coolers, are subject to search by staff before and after entering the beach.

Bonfires, cooking with a fire of any kind, and camping are prohibited.

All persons are restricted from remaining on the oceanfront beaches after 10:00 p.m. except during approved special events and ceremonies. Persons actively engaged in fishing are permitted to be upon any oceanfront beach after the established closing time and through 5:00 a.m. of any day.

FOR THE COMFORT OF OUR GUESTS

Conduct and/or the use of inappropriate language that interferes with the use of the beach by other guests is prohibited and may result in revocation of the beach badge/wristband.

Amplified music or audio of any kind is prohibited. Boom boxes, speaker systems, and other devices are not permitted on the beach. Please use your earbuds when listening to music from your hand-held device.

Ball playing is generally prohibited but may be permitted by the Lifeguard Chief in certain areas of the beach when conditions permit.

No person shall bring onto the beach serving trays, warming trays, pots, pans, or devices utilized for the preparation or storage of food.

No person shall bring onto the beach tables or stands or boards or other devices positioned to function as a table.

No person shall feed on the beach or Boardwalk Promenade any wild animals including, without limitation, seagulls, foxes, cats, and dogs.
